


What are Open Educational Resources?

- ⇒ Open Educational Resources are educational materials that are freely and legally available on the Internet for anyone to reuse, revise, remix, and redistribute.
- ⇒ OERs are the textbooks of the future, saving students millions of dollars and offering faculty opportunities to adapt, create, and share knowledge in a rapidly-expanding community of educators.
- ⇒ OERs can be complete electronic textbooks, full university courses, modules or learning activities, lesson plans, worksheets, readings, interactive games--any learning resource that is free to use.

NMC's Open Educational Resources Pilot Project

The NMC Foundation Innovation Committee has provided funds to award ten faculty members an iPad or \$500 to adapt one of their courses to use all open resources to be taught in Fall 2015. The project team will then survey faculty and students, summarize what we learned, and make recommendations for the future of OER at NMC.

What's Next?

Making the leap from traditional publishers' textbooks to Open Educational Resources takes time and expertise from faculty, librarians, and educational technologists.

In a recent study, faculty using OER in Washington identified nine types of support they need to incorporate free text materials into their teaching:

- Endorsement from the college and department,
- Clear policies on the use of OER
- Training on how to use OER
- Easy and organized pathways to access OER
- A local support system with local experts
- Department level initiatives
- Funding opportunities
